Background

CareSource has been approved by the University of New Mexico to offer our own ECHO series. Project ECHO®, is a unique tele-mentoring program designed to create virtual communities of learners by bringing together health care providers and subject matter experts using videoconference technology, brief lecture presentations, and case-based learning. We are excited to launch a series for in-network primary care providers to increase the availability of Medication-Assisted Treatment for patients with substance use disorder in the state of Indiana!

You may be the first health care professional a patient encounters when engaging in treatment, during relapse, or when they need a referral to treatment. We know you have long-term relationships with your patients, and some of them feel more comfortable talking to you about their substance use disorder since you are already treating their other medical conditions.

Summary

The Waiver Elimination Mainstreaming Addiction (MAT) Act, Section 1262 of the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2023, removes the federal requirement for practitioners to submit a Notice of Intent (have a waiver) to prescribe medications like buprenorphine for opioid use disorder in their practice, if permitted by applicable state law. Opioid use disorder prescriptions, like all prescriptions, **now only require a standard DEA registration number. There is no longer a patient cap!**

Providers have an opportunity to attend and earn up to **12 FREE Continuing Medical Education (CME) credits**. Providers that attend 60% of this ECHO clinic meet the requirements for <u>Indiana State</u> <u>Loan Repayment Program (IN-SLRP)</u>.
